GOVERNING BODY REPORTS

Mayor Myhre- Attended the Eagle Dinner for Parker Petty of Troup 61 on March 23rd, 2019. The first "Meet the Mayor" event was held April 1st at the Stafford Branch of the Ocean County Library. The event was well attended and will hold another in July. Mayor Myhre introduced our new Township Administrator, Matthew von der Hayden. He thanked the Mayor and is looking forward to working with everyone and stated please feel free to reach out to him.

Councilman Krier-Advised on April 4th there will be a Brunch and Learn Memory Lecture event at 10 am at the Bay Avenue Community Center. A Movie will be shown at 1:00 pm. Garden Club meets on May 10th at the Bay Avenue Community Center. Betti Anne McVey wishes to remind residents the May is Older Americans Month. Councilman Krier read the Water/Sewer report and advised the Consumer Confidence Report is available either on the Stafford website or can be obtained at the Municipal Building.

Councilman Steadman- Gave the monthly report for the Building and Zoning Department. The Environmental Commission will be holding Arbor Day on May 3rd, 2019. Everyone is invited to attend.

Councilman Guariglia- Reported on the Stafford Township EMS. Squad 38 was dispatched March 30th to stand by at the Warren Grove Fire Station where the NJ Forest Fire Service had their incident command post set up. They worked side by side with Squad 85 after 24 hours they were released.

Councilman Pfancook-Reported on the Jennifer Bay Beach. Reached out to George Yockachonis, Public Works and he confirmed because of the new guidelines with the DEP and the EPA equipment costs could range from \$10,000 to \$30,000. Will hold off and search for any grants that may be available. Cleanup of Beach will begin the third week of April. Neptune Basin has been an issue for many years, Public Works took some steps to create a spillway to help with the issue. Cost of the spillway for the basin with materials was approximately \$1,400.00.

Councilman Henken-With the spring weather residents and children are beginning to venture outside. Please drive cautiously. Spring Festival will be held on April 14th. Egg Hunt will be held 12:00 to 3:00 pm. Summer Camp registration will be held on April 10th at the Ocean Acres Community Center. Registration is also available on line. Upcoming trip to Longwood Gardens also. Rutgers training for coaches was held, 34 coaches in attendance. Stafford Mayor and Council would like to recognize today as World Autism Day. Looking to start a challenger league for children with special needs and are looking for volunteers.

Councilman Williams-Will be meeting with Monica Zabrowski of the Environmental Commission regarding the Green Team. Discussion again with the Knights of Columbus regarding street cleaning. He also reported on Dial-A-Ride. Also working on Channel 22 to make some improvements and to update cameras in the Council meeting room.
